Tomorrow is a Holy Day of Obligation, with Holy Mass at 9:00 AM and 5:45 PM. ### *Pray for the Poor Souls in November*

- Double up on prayers and sacrifices for departed loved ones and friends during this powerful season of the dead. Don't waste your sufferings.
- Pray the Litany for the Faithful Departed.
- Pray the Office for the Dead.
- Pray the *Rosary for the Holy Souls in Purgatory* before the Blessed Sacrament.
- Enroll your family and friends, living and deceased, in the Purgatorial Society, a spiritual solidarity of prayer.
- Visit cemeteries with your children. Teach youth to pray the Eternal Rest Prayer. Sprinkle holy water on the graves in the cemetery.
- Light blessed candles. The burning candle is a sign of our prayer, a bright, silent intercessor for the holy souls.
- Light an Eight Day Votive Candle in church.
- Say the “Eternal Rest” Prayer on your Rosary Beads.



### Hallow Halloween and the Whole Month of November.

#### **Visit the graves of your loved ones.**

This applies more to All Souls' Day (Nov. 2nd) than it does to All Saints' Day (Nov 1st). Still the point is to remember our loved ones and to pray for those who have died marked with the sign of faith. Death is not the last word. Christ has overcome death by His own sorrowful passion and death through the resurrection. That is the source of our hope and strength of all the saints.

*An indulgence is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in Purgatory. This indulgence is a plenary one from November 1 through November 8 and can be gained on each one of these days. On the other days of the year this indulgence is a partial one of seven years.*

- When passing a cemetery, pray the Eternal rest prayer.
- Take a “prayer stroll” through your local cemetery to pray for all those buried there. Bring holy water to sprinkle on the graves. (It is one of the first sacramentals of the Church. Holy water refreshes the holy souls.)
- Visit the graves of your loved ones and clean sites in a spirit of prayer and penance.
- Around the graves of your loved ones, plant flowers to honor the final resting place of a Temple of God.

#### **Be Holy for Halloween, All month, and Always!**

If you persevere in the love and grace of God, you too shall be a saint. The whole point of “All Hallows” is to remind us to be “hallowed” or “sanctified”. Most of us won't have our own particular feast day and so All Saints' Day will be our feast day. It is the feast day for most of the Church's saints, those who lived peaceably, followed Christ, loved their families, accomplished their duties in life and passed on to the next life. May their prayers be with us.

**You! A Saint**

All Saints' Day reminds us that you also can be a saint. It isn't difficult, in fact it is quite simple. Love God and serve Him. Surely it isn't hard to love and serve God, the God Who has done so much for you; loved you from all eternity, gave you being, cares for you every moment of the day. The God Who created you for happiness, an eternity of happiness.

Yes, we can all be saints. God wants us to be saints. He wants us to be His friends in this world and in Heaven.

The Blessed Virgin, the Apostles, St. John the Baptist, St. Francis Cabrini, who lived right here in America, St. Agnes, St. Martin of Tours, St. Elizabeth, St. Maria Goretti, and many, many more once were boys and girls. They had mothers and fathers just as we have. They lived in this world. They played, laughed and cried just as we do.

The Saints are our brothers and sisters, for the Communion of Saints makes of us all one family. The Saints are God's friends and ours. They will help us on our way to sanctity. We should read stories of their lives, for their holiness will inspire us to avoid sin and to imitate them in holiness.

We, like the Saints, when assisting at Holy Mass, will be grateful for the opportunity of offering with the priest the sacrifice of Calvary again renewed on our altars. We will long for Holy Communion and will receive often, knowing that Jesus wants our souls to be well fed and cared for.

We will become more holy, more loving, more kind, and in this way we can become saints.

**Don't Forget Them**

The suffering souls in Purgatory are still on the way to Heaven; but they have arrived at the stage when their salvation is sure; there is no further doubt or danger of not reaching Heaven.

This life is the time to win our place in Heaven. After death, all that is to happen is what we earned in this life, whether joy or punishment or both. So the soul that dies in the love of God has won a strict right to Heaven, a definite place in Heaven. But when a soul departs this life in venial sin, there are two reasons for suffering: one, because it has never repented venial sin; the other, because, after repenting and being forgiven, the soul still owes a debt of punishment to atone for the sin.

It is easy to see that a soul in this state cannot enter Heaven. Silently they wait, begging us not to forget them. We perform an act of charity if we remember the Poor Souls when we assist at Holy Mass.

We can remember these Poor Souls in our morning offering. We can ask God to take the rewards that we may gain during the day and apply them for the relief of the Holy Souls. In this way we show our love of God and our neighbor for in freeing these souls from Purgatory, we open Heaven to them where they will adore, praise, and love God for all eternity.

"As long as you did it to one of these my least brethren, you did it to Me" – refers in a particular way to the souls in Purgatory.

**CHRISTIAN FAITH**

*Every Christian is bound to believe that in one God there are three distinct Persons, perfectly equal, of the same substance, and having the same nature: the Father, Who proceeds from no one; the Son, Who is born of the Father before all ages; and the Holy Ghost, Who proceeds eternally from the Father and the Son as from one principle; and that the three Persons are all equally eternal, equal in wisdom and power, and are all three one and the same Lord, one and the same God.*

**✠NEXT SUNDAY**

The opening of Our Mother of Good Counsel. Our Lady of Suffrage: Two afternoon Cemetery Rosary Processions are planned. The **Special Second Collection**, and the **Blessing of Religious Articles** takes place at all Masses. Remember to set your clock back: "Fall Back" to standard time. Sunday classes are at 10:40 AM.

**Set Your Missal:** Pentecost XXIV (Epiphany V), commemoration of All Saints, Trinity Preface. The Rosary Cemetery visits replace Vespers.

**✠TIME CHANGE**

Don't forget that the time changes **November 7th** at 2:00 AM. Be sure to set your clocks the night before so that you arrive on time for Mass.

**✠ROSARY CEMETERY PROCESSIONS**

You are welcome to pray the Rosary with us for one or more indulgenced Cemetery visits during the Octave of All Souls. This Plenary Indulgence is gained under the usual conditions, in favor of the Souls in Purgatory.

**Thursday, November 4th**, our school children depart at 1:15 PM to visit Gate of Heaven Cemetery, where so many of our dear departed repose, awaiting the Last Day.

Sunday, November 7th, at 3:00 PM the Rosary Confraternity sponsors two Rosary Processions -

**St Mary's Cemetery**, Covington with Fr. Larrabee and

**Gate of Heaven Cemetery**, Cincinnati, with Fr. McGuire.

Plan to process and pray for the Poor Souls with us.

# SGG School News

## A Periodic Update on What's Happening at St. Gertrude the Great School

October 2010

*The school year is now in full swing. The school choir has already assisted a number of times in the liturgical life of our church. The school has put on its first bake sale of the year and there's been a great response to our latest school projects. All this and we're still only in the first semester of the term!*

### **School Choir**

Bishop Dolan has remarked a number of times in the past on the ethereal quality the singing of the school choir brings to the celebration of Holy Mass at St. Gertrude the Great. His Excellency has often used the word *angelic* to describe the children's voices. How fitting then that the school choir helped celebrate Michaelmas on September 29<sup>th</sup> by singing at the Solemn High Mass. The children alternated singing the parts of the Mass with Fr. Ercoli. The combination of priestly and student voices made for a very special celebration of St. Michael's feast day.

Later, in the afternoon of Michaelmas, the school choir took part in the singing of Solemn Vespers. Also last month, on "Angel Sunday," the school children gave the adult SGG choir a day of rest by singing all the hymns, propers and ordinary at the regular Sunday high Mass.

Folks who watch and listen to Mass at St Gertrude the Great over the internet have complimented the singing of the school choir many times. Along these lines, a parishioner shared with us the following story. He happened to be in the parish office around the time for the daily high Mass and was enjoying listening to the CD of beautiful liturgical music that the staff was playing. When he asked what the CD was, the staff member told him that there was no CD playing. No CD? What were they listening to then? he asked. The staff member pointed to a speaker in the office wall and said "That's the kids singing at Mass."

### **Columbus Day Bake Sale**

The school held the first bake sale of the school year on Columbus Day. Folks brought in all kinds of wonderful baked items and the sale was quite a success. Thank you to all the generous parishioners who contributed to the sale.

### **Boxtops for Education Off to a Great Start**

In September's newsletter we introduced you to the school's newest fund raising project, the Labels for Education Program.
