Today we continue the Forty Hours Devotion. **We need adorers this afternoon!** Sunday classes will be at 10:50 AM. October Devotions with Rosary will be at 4:00 PM. Vespers of Christ the King will be at 4:45 PM. Note that the evening Mass is at 5:30, not 5:45. Closing ceremonies are at 6:45.

¶ ALL SAINTS DAY

First Friday is the feast of All Saints, a *Holy Day of Obligation*. All are obliged to attend Mass under pain of mortal sin. Abstinence is dispensed. Meat may be eaten. Masses are at 7:00 (worker's Mass, no sermon) and 9:00 AM, and 5:45 PM. Exposition, October and First Friday Devotions & Benediction are at 5:10. Vespers of the Day and of the Dead are at 7:00 PM.

¶ ALL SOULS DAY

Many Holy Masses are offered on Saturday, November 2nd for All Souls' Day. Try to assist at Mass, and gain an indulgence for the Poor Souls. Poor Souls Remembrance envelopes are in the pews. Please fill one out and return it to the bookstore, collection, or office.

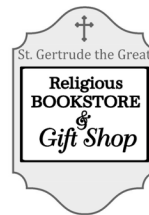
After the last sale, remaining items that you made can be taken home. Please pick up your items by December 1st. We will not be storing things for next year.

They're worshipping idols in Rome, and enshrining these demons (for the pagan gods are devils from hell) in the churches. **Bishop Sanborn** explains this idolatry, and its V2/Modernist connection, in today's bulletin. Read it, arm yourself with the truth. But do more. Go out of your way to adore, to offer reparation to the one true God whose majesty is so offended today. Come back to church this afternoon, and especially this evening, to overcome the "Outrages" the Angel bewailed at Fatima, as well as the customary "Indifference" of most Catholics.

This is the feast of Christ the King. Show it. Live it. In the face of worldwide apostasy, respond to the Fatima Message. God means to bring about the Kingship of Christ, *here and now*, by means of our Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Much good remains to be done if Christ is to reign as King.

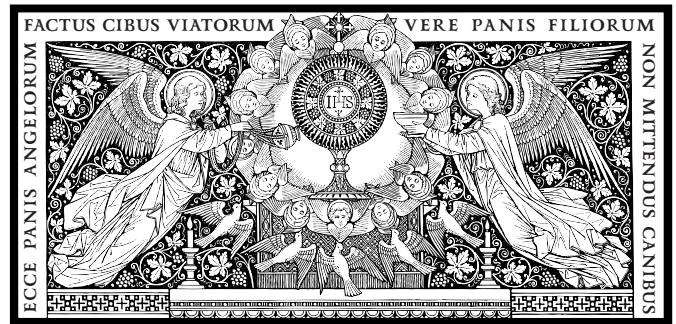
heard. This is why we're spending a whole *forty* hours praying this weekend.

Bergoglio has gone one step further in the project of totally destroying the Catholic religion. Owing to his ecology fanaticism, he invited indigenous Amazonian people to the Vatican gardens, where they performed an act of idolatry. Bergoglio actively assisted at the proceedings, giving them his warm approval.

The goddess who was adored was none other than Pachamama, who is a fertility goddess among the Incas and neighboring peoples.

All of this comes as another episode of Bergoglio's Earth Religion, in which he is attempting to change the Roman Catholic Church into an agency to save the planet from all sorts of wicked exploitation and the whales, of course, from the plastic straws.

Idolatry was always considered an *abomination* in the Old Testament. St. Paul was also very negative and judgmental about it. This negativity and rigidity are no obstacle for the Modernist, however. The Modernist believes that God is present in everyone in a supernatural way, and that He reveals Himself to all in their daily experiences of life. Therefore everyone worships this true God revealing Himself, although they may believe different things about Him. These differences of belief come about because of cultural differences. So Catholics venerate the Virgin Mary. Indigenous Amazonians worship Pachamama. There are merely cultural variations here. It is all the same.

Dogma is an absolutely meaningless thing for the Modernist. According to the Modernists, religious beliefs evolve over time from the varied cultural, geographical, and historical environments of diverse peoples.

Modernism, therefore, makes ecumenism possible, and conversely, ecumenism *demand*s Modernism as its basis. Ecumenism would make no sense without Modernism.
